Throughout this transition, your participation in activities such as the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT), Bethany history events, focus groups, community needs assessments, and visioning exercises has been invaluable. Each of these efforts, which are intentionally "pastor neutral," is designed to benefit our entire Bethany family and is essential as Christ helps us determine our path forward. We are also thankful for Pastor Cheryl's ongoing service as our interim pastor during this important time.

Next Steps: MSP Workshop

Looking Ahead: Our Shared Priorities

Once a new pastor is called, the pastor and congregation will work together to address areas of opportunity and priorities identified through our Transition Activities over the past six months. Bethany's top five priorities are:

- Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to Bethany.
- Develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of Bethany.
- Strengthen the pastoral response of the church in serving people in times of need.
- Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life.
- Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships, such as small groups, nurtured friendships, and shared meals.


FIRST PART OF ORGAN WORK COMPLETED

The beautiful voices we have come to love are now reaching others as they lead the National Anthem or songs at the Yard Goats games on selected dates.

Thank to Liz, Millie and Kenz for bringing their talent and inspiration to this new, for us, and diverse audience, **YOU MAKE US PROUD!!**

A repeat, below is the history of one of the songs they sing.

HYMN OF THE MONTH: O Beautiful for Spacious Skies, #888

This is truly an all-American hymn. Katherine Bates, a professor who was lecturing in Colorado (probably in 1893) took a trip to the top of Pikes Peak. She looked out over the majesty of the mountains and having travelled much of the country to get to Colorado was inspires to write these now immortal and inspiring words about the country she loved. (I had a similar experience when I reached the top of Pike's Peak one early 4th of July morning-when I was young.)

The music was written by Samuel A Ward an organist, as he was crossing New York Harbor. The story goes that he wrote it down on the cuff of his shirt and then used it as an anthem for two hundred men and boys at his church in Newark.

The music and text were later combined to produce our much-loved national hymn.

We need everyone's help to make this a success. This will be a great way to let Cromwell and beyond see what a great community of faith we have here at Bethany.


