Dear People of God,

This year, Easter Sunday is a day before April Fool's Day. I remember as a child playing practical jokes on this day. Perhaps you recall a prank or two of your own. Most of the pranks I pulled involved something that was not what it seemed to be: a "whoopee" cushion, fake blood, rubber snake, plastic vomit-you get the picture. I always loved seeing the look of surprise on someone who realized that they had been fooled.

One way to think of resurrection is God fooling death. Death thought that it could defeat God. Yes, Jesus died on the cross, but on Easter morning he rose. The resurrection of Christ is the defeat of death once and for all.

The gospel lesson from Mark which is read at the festival of the Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter Sunday) begins as follows:

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back.

These three faithful women, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James and Salome, set out early in the morning to do something that they wished they didn't have to do- anoint the lifeless body of the crucified Jesus. They didn't know how they would even be able to gain access to the tomb. The large stone was a barrier that was just too big for them to handle alone. But they went ahead anyway.

What a surprise was in store for them that. When they arrived at the tomb, they found that the stone had already been rolled back. But that wasn't the only surprise. They are told that Jesus has been raised and that they will see him again. They are frightened, terrified and amazed.

Our Easter mornings are very different from that first Easter morning. We aren't frightened or perhaps even amazed by the resurrection. Instead, our Easter mornings are filled with joy and beauty. We "pull out all the stops" in our church celebrations. There is a festival liturgy complete with a procession, special music and a chancel filled with fragrant flowers. Afterwards, family and friends continue the celebration as they gather to share delicious meals. Children hunt for Easter eggs and enjoy the treats that have been left in their Easter baskets.

As wonderful as all this, I can't help but thinking that those women have something to teach us. They were willing to set out to do something that many would have thought impossible. They obstacle they faced proved not to be a barrier at all. When they discovered what God was up to, they were able to move beyond their fear and amazement to share the good news with others. If they didn't, Mark's gospel would have ended with Joseph burying Jesus in the tomb.

The joy of Easter and the resurrection is that God in Christ has already set aside the barriers that threaten to rob us of eternal life-sin and death. This amazing gift of love means to free us from all our fears. Death is not the ultimate ending that it seems to be. No fooling!

Christ is risen! Allelulia!

Distribution of Holy Communion in Pews

April Kid's Page




Believing in the message of the cross makes you wise. This treat is a great reminder to be wise in God's ways.

What you need:

- · Slice of whole wheat bread
- Circle cookie cutter (or jar lid)
- Butter knife
- Nut butter (peanut, hazelnut, etc.)

- Enjoy and be wise to God's message!






