Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Several years ago I led a book group in a discussion of William Young's "The Shack." This New York Times bestseller is a work of fiction that wrestles with the question, "Where is God in a world so filled with unspeakable pain?" The age old question of theodicy, which ponders the true nature of God in light of human suffering, is one that many believers wrestle with some time in their life. The "great sadness" that descends upon the protagonist Mack is something that we too might experience one day.

One need not look very long or hard to find suffering in this world. The news is full of accounts of human suffering. Wars and acts of terrorism persist in many parts of the world. Poverty abounds, even in our country. Drive by shootings and drug overdoses claim the lives of our young people. Motor vehicle accidents, inoperable tumors, home invasions, natural disasters, random mishaps and more remind us of the fragility of life.

The "dis-ease" we experience in less dramatic ways such as the pain of broken relationships, the disappointment of less than fulfilling careers, or financial worries also causes us untold anxiety and suffering. During times such as these it is natural to ask, "Where is God?" "Why does God allow these bad things to happen?" "Why doesn't God answer our prayers?"

In a sermon preached in 1943 during the battle of Stalingrad, the theologian and rector of the University of Hamburg Helmut Thielicke spoke of the "silence of God." Using the account of the Canaanite woman in Matthew 15, Thielicke posited that we have no rightful claim to God's mercy. The Canaanite woman pleads with Jesus to heal her daughter, "Have mercy on me." First Jesus is silent, and then he responds "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Is-

rael." She is an undeserving outsider, just as we all are in the face of God. "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."

This doesn't seem to be the Jesus that we know and love. Yet, there is divine justice in this silence and rejection. As Thielicke puts it, "It is in no sense the duty or obligation of Jesus to bear my sin and take me through the black gate of death. If he does this, it cannot be taken for granted."

In the end, the woman prevails, "Even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from the masters' table." It is the humility of this woman and her total reliance on undeserved mercy, that in Thielicke's words "cause the heart of God to prevail against the silence of God." As Luther puts it, the Canaanite woman has "flung the sack of Jesus' promises at his feet and he cannot step over it."

God's grace is something we can never earn. It is God's gift of love to those who do not deserve, given to those whoever God chooses. When we demand grace, when we take it for granted, or when want to claim it only for ourselves, we might remember that it was only the faith of a Canaanite woman and a Roman centurion that Jesus called great.

May we learn from that Canaanite woman and be willing to wrestle with our sometimes silent God. May we trust that the crucified and risen one who endured the silence of God while hanging from the cross will be merciful. When it seems as if there is nowhere to turn and no one to turn to, let us turn with hope to Christ.

Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. John 6:68

Updated Face Mask Policy

Effective Sunday February 27, wearing face masks during worship services, coffee hour and other Bethany Lutheran Church events will be optional. We trust that you will make your own decision regarding wearing a face mask based on your particular level of risk. As always, we ask that you err on the side of caution and remain home if you are experiencing any COVID like symptoms.

The one exception to this policy is that masks will be required for our preschool age Sunday school children who are unvaccinated. Preschool Sunday school teachers will also wear masks during class to serve as role models and in solidarity with their students. While in the sanctuary, parents may decide to allow their children to remain mask free.

We will continue to monitor the pandemic metrics and adapt our policy as conditions and guidelines from public health agencies change. If you have any questions, please feel free to speak with me or a church council member.

ASCENSION CRAFT



Use this craft to remember where Jesus is now and the promise of his return.

What you need:

- An adult to help
- 4 cotton balls
- Blue plastic cup
- Glue
- Scissors
- White paper
- Markers or crayons
- Fishing line (about 14")
- Paper clip

What you do:

1. Set the cup upside down. Pull apart the cotton balls, forming cloud shapes, and glue them around the cup.
2. With an adult's help, poke a hole in the bottom of the cup.
3. On the paper, draw and cut out a Jesus figure. Color both sides.
4. Poke a hole atop Jesus, string fishing line through the hole and tie a knot.
5. String the other end through the hole in the cup. Tie the end to a paper clip.
6. Pull up the paper clip to take Jesus into the clouds.




